Activities and Services

IALLT's strong sense of community promotes the sharing of expertise across all levels of instruction. IALLT members meet face-to-face every two years at the IALLT biennial conference. They also gather at the conferences of affiliated organizations like CALICO, ACTFL, and TESOL.

Online communication is vital to IALLT's members. The LLTI listserv, co-sponsored by IALLT, is a lively forum for information exchange. IALLT also hosts a members-only wiki.
